

**RESOLUTION 098-2019**  
*Amend Parking Resolution 10-1992*

Cuyahoga County, Ohio

Be it Resolved by the Township Trustees of *Olmsted* Township, that

WHEREAS, Ohio Law has authorized Townships to regulate parking in the Township,

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees deem it necessary for the safety and welfare of the Township and its residents,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Township of Olmsted, State of Ohio;

Section 1. That pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 505.17 as amended, this Board of Trustees hereby establishes a parking ban on those roads, streets, lanes, drives, highways, and other public access ways, within the Township of Olmsted, during the hours of two A.M. (2 am) and six A.M.(6 am),

Further, that no person owning or driving any vehicle shall park or allow to remain parked any such vehicle upon the traveled roadway, street, lane, drive, highway, and other public access ways, within the Township, during this time period, except under those conditions listed in Section 4 of this Resolution.

Further, that no person owning or driving any vehicle shall park or allow to remain parked any such vehicle upon Glenbrooke Drive on any day during the academic school year when Olmsted Falls High School is in session and between the hours of Eight A.M. (8 am) and Three P.M. (3 pm), except under those conditions listed in Section 4 of this Resolution.

Further, that said regulation and order shall be subject to the limitations, restrictions, and exceptions in sections 4511.01 to 4511.76 and 4513.02 to 4513.37 and 505.17 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 2. The Board of Trustees or their designated agent, may order any vehicles found in violation of this resolution, to be cited for said violation.

Further, The Board of Trustees or their designated agent, may order into storage any vehicle parked in violation of this Resolution or order, if the violation is not one that is required to be handled pursuant to Chapter 4521. of the Ohio Revised Code. The owner or any lien holder of a vehicle ordered into storage may claim the vehicle upon presentation of proof of ownership, which may be evidenced by a certificate of title to the vehicle, and further, said owner or lien holder shall be liable for the payment of all expenses, charges and fines incurred as a result of the parking violation and removal and storage of the vehicle.

Section 3. Whoever violates this resolution and order as adopted pursuant to this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor, and shall be fined not less than Ten (\$10.00) dollars, nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) dollars.

Fines levied and collected under this section shall be paid into the police district revenue fund.

Section 4. The owner or driver of any vehicle, that requests permission of the Board of Trustees or their designated agent, to park their vehicle(s) on the road, street, drive, lane, highway, or other public access way, during the stipulated time period, and receives such permission, shall be exempt from citations, fines and levies as stipulated and governed under this Resolution.

Said person(s) requesting permission to park, shall notify the Board of Trustees or the designated agent, as to time, place, duration, and circumstances for said request. This permission shall be granted for a reasonable amount of time only, after which, the requesting person(s) shall no longer be exempt from citations, fines and levies as stipulated under this Resolution.



Section 5. Therefore, this resolution shall take effect and enforcement shall commence fourteen days following the posing of designated signs which shall state the parking restrictions and bans, further having been prominently displayed.

However, written warnings citations, for those found in violation of this resolution, may be issued during the fourteen (14) day grace period for public awareness as to the restrictions and bans imposed by this Resolution.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board of Township Trustees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
